Sessional Instructor Position – Fall 2015 – REM 445

Applications are invited for one sessional instructor position during the Fall 2015 Semester for REM 445.

Course description: The objective of this course is to provide students with theory and practical experience in the area of **applied environmental toxicology**. The course will cover (i) theoretical principles of environmental distribution and toxicity of pollutants, (ii) practical techniques for the assessment of the environmental behaviour, toxicity and ecological & human health risks of contaminants in the environment, and (iii) a critique of current environmental management practices in Canada. Students apply these techniques in a class project. The course material is essential for those expecting to be involved in pollution-related issues.
